Recording all test results helps scientists stay ahead of the virus by spotting new outbreaks quickly and advising how to respond. Reporting results is easy. Go to: Report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) or call: 119 free from a mobile or landline.





All results should be reported, even if your result is negative or void. You should also keep a note of results in case the school ask to see them.


Once Thrive is introduced your child may be involved in Thrive activities, either one to one or in small groups to support their wellbeing and development.




WWF Penguins and Polar Bears live science lesson
