COVID

As I am sure you have heard this week the Prime Minister announced a 4-week pause at Step 3. It is expected that England will move to Step 4 on 19th July 2021, although the data will be reviewed after 2 weeks in case the risks have reduced. The government will continue to monitor the data and the move to Step 4 will be confirmed one week in advance.

This will have an impact on activities planned for summer term, as face to face activities require the current system of controls to continue to be implemented in education settings.
